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Vaccines

Parents urged to check their children are up to date with vaccines. Measles is a highly infectious, but preventable, disease that can lead to serious health problems.

Symptoms of measles include a high fever, sore red watery eyes and a blotchy red-brown rash, and it is particularly easy to catch in environments when in close contact with others.

The MMR vaccination is an easy and effective way to protect against measles, however, vaccine uptake rates are reducing and as a result cases of measles are on the increase. Children are offered the first dose of the MMR vaccine when aged one year and the second dose aged 3 years 4 months.

We're urging parents of young children, teenagers and adults to check they are up to date with their MMR vaccines – it's never too late to catch up with your vaccines. Get in touch with your GP for more information or to book your appointment.







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Child Seat Check Event



Warwickshire Road Safety Partnership invites you to attend free child car seat and vehicle safety check events being held throughout Warwickshire, 22nd - 26th May 2023.

Our child seat check events help raise awareness of the importance of correctly fitted child seats to reduce avoidable child passenger casualties and supporting drivers to undertake essential vehicle checks.

From previous years, we know that around 80% of child car seats in Warwickshire do not fit the car, are incompatible with the child, or need adjustment such as re-routing of seatbelt or adjustment of head restraint.

Child Seat Safety, experts in the field of car seat safety and IOSH accredited in car seat training will lead and deliver the events. With over 40 years of child seat knowledge Child Seat Safety will be available to check and adjust seats and answer questions relating to car seat safety that you may have.

This event is open to all Warwickshire residents, and beyond, and is completely free to attend with no need to book.
