

As we come to the end of a busy and exiting Summer Term, we wanted to take a moment to reflect on the wonderful experiences the children have enjoyed over the past few months.

We began the term by watching our caterpillars transforming into butterflies. This magical life cycle fascinated the children and gave them a hand- on experience of nature.

One of the highlights of the term was exploring the topic 'People who help us', which inspired some lovely conversation and imaginative role-play. The children learned about different roles in our community, including a visit from a dentist, and they learned how to keep their teeth healthy. We also had a visitor from Warwickshire Road Safety.

We also continued developing important skills through our Forest School sessions, where the children explored the outdoors, learned about nature, and built confidence in their physical abilities.

In PE with Andy, the children practised throwing, hitting, catching balls, and running to get ready for Fun Run in support of our sponsorship event. Their enthusiasm and energy were great!


